"Flying and Buzzing in the Garden"

SECTION A. Floral Designs
ELIGIBLE FOR DESIGNERS' CHOICE AWARD

Minimum of 4 entries by reservation only. Designer has complete freedom to choose design and plant materials.
No accessories allowed. Design staged at table height on 1/2 of black draped buffet size table.

Class 1. "Autumn Migration"

SECTION B. Table Designs
ELIGIBLE FOR TABLE ARTISTRY AWARD

Minimum of 4 entries in each class by reservation only. Designer has complete freedom to choose plant materials.
Accessories permitted in all classes.

Class 2. "Autumn Picnic" an Exhibition Table, not meant to be functional, created artistically to suggest service of food. Exhibitors to provide staging such as niche, frame etc. Exhibit will be staged on 1/2 of black draped buffet size table.

Class 3. "Witches and Goblins" a functional informal dinner for two staged on a card table provided by exhibitor.

SECTION C. Petite Designs
ELIGIBLE FOR PETITE AWARD

Minimum of 4 entries by reservation only. Designers have complete freedom to choose plant materials. Designs will be staged on black draped table at eye level. Exhibitors may provide niches as additional staging.

Class 4. "Bees in our Bonnets" a petite design not to exceed 5" in any direction.

GENERAL RULES

This is a small Standard Flower Show conforming to the requirements and objectives set by the National Garden Clubs, Inc. and the 2017 revised Handbook for Flower Shows. This schedule is the law of the show.

1. All classes are open to any amateur gardener or designer.
2. Entries will be accepted between 10 to Noon on Friday October 15. Late entries may be accepted for exhibition only.
3. Do not use plants on the California conservation list.
4. No artificial plant material may be used in any division.
5. National Garden Clubs accredited judges will judge the show. Judging will begin promptly at 1:00 PM on Friday October 15, 2021. The decision of the judges is final.
6. The standard system of awarding will be used. Only one first (blue), one second (red) and one third (yellow) may be awarded in each class if merited. One or more honorable mentions (white) May be awarded to merited entries.
7. The Flower Show Committee will exercise care but cannot be responsible for loss or breakages. Exhibitor's name and phone number should be on the bottom of containers.
8. San Diego Floral Association and Balboa Park will not be responsible for personal injuries.
9. Exhibits must be removed immediately following the show at 4:00 PM on Saturday October 16, 2020.



HORTICULTURE RULES

1. Horticulture exhibits must be fresh plant material grown by exhibitor and may not be treated in any way.
2. All horticulture specimens must be correctly named with both binomial and common name whenever possible. The binomial name is necessary for a top award.
3. An exhibitor May enter more than one entry per class, provided each is a different variety, cultivar, type or color.
4. All worthy cut specimens will be displayed in clear containers furnished by the Committee. Wedging is permitted using celery or fresh stems.
5. Horticulture exhibits shall have been in the possession of the exhibitor for a minimum of 90 days.
6. Classes may be subdivided by the Committee.
7. The scale of points by which entries will be judged may be found in the Handbook for Flower Shows, revised 2017.

HORTICULTURE DIVISION TOP AWARDS

Award of Merit - May be awarded to botanically named blue ribbon winner scoring 95 or above in Section A, Cut Flowers.

Arboreal Award - May be awarded to botanically named blue ribbon winner scoring 95 or above in Section B, Shrubs and Trees.

Award of Horticulture Excellence - May be awarded to the highest scoring exhibit entered by one individual in the entire Horticulture Division.

Division I - HORTICULTURE

"In the Garden"

All specimens must be properly labeled with binomial name to win top exhibitor awards. No foliage is allowed below the water line.

SECTION A. Cut Flowers

"Birds and Bees"

ELIGIBLE FOR AWARD OF MERIT

One stem per entry, may have more than one flower.

Class 1. Annuals

Class 2. Roses

Class 3. Perennials

SECTION B. Shrubs and Trees

"Flowers and Trees"

ELIGIBLE FOR ARBOREAL AWARD

Cut portions of vines are not eligible. Cut specimens must be no more than 30" in length, include an apical tip, central leader and several nodes.

Class 4. Flowering Branch

Class 5. Fruited, berries or cone bearing branch

Class 6. Foliage branch (broad leaf/narrow leaf)

SECTION C. Container Grown Plants

"Little Gardens"

10" maximum diameter, single variety (may have more than one rooted plant of the same specimen)

Class 7. Foliage Plant

Class 8. Flowering Plant

Class 9. Cactus

Class 10. Succulent other than cactus

DESIGN RULES

1. Flower Show General Rules apply.
2. Plant material need not be grown by the exhibitor.
3. The design must be the work of only one individual.
4. Only one entry is permitted by an exhibitor in each class.
5. Reservations are required for all classes. Call or text Design Entries Chair Kathy Taylor de Murillo at 619-408-9705.
6. All designs must contain some plant material. No artificial flowers, foliage, fruit or vegetables are permitted. Fresh plant material may not be treated in any manner, such as paint, glitter, oil etc. Dried plant material may be treated. Any cut fresh fruits or vegetables must be properly sealed.
7. Drapes and underlays are permitted in all classes. No religious symbols or flags are permitted. Accessories are permitted in Section B, Table Designs.
8. Class titles are intended to stimulate the imagination, not to be taken literally.
9. Exhibitors should list properly named plant material on a 3 x 5 card to be eligible for top awards.
10. If a designer is unable to fulfill an assignment, they must find a replacement or notify the Design Entries Chairman.

DESIGN DIVISION TOP AWARDS

Designers Choice Award - May be awarded to the highest scoring exhibit in Section A.

Table Artistry Award - May be awarded to the highest scoring exhibit in Section B.

Petite Award - May be awarded to the highest scoring exhibit in Section C.

Award of Design Excellence - May be awarded to the highest scoring blue ribbon winner in the Design Division
